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1) INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND

Contract type: Consultancy and Services

Duration of assignment: 4 Months

Type: Firm/Individual both

WWF-Pakistan with the financial support of FCDO, implementing a project titled, "Scaling up nature-based solutions for improving integrated water resources management and enhanced water security in Pakistan". The project aims to pilot Nature-based Solutions (NbS) at selected locations in Gilgit-Baltistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa in partnership with relevant stakeholders. Water management for improving the health of natural ecosystems, better water resource management, and livelihood improvement will be outcomes of the project interventions.

2) GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1) The WWF-PAKISTAN reserves the right to reject or accept any proposal. The WWF-PAKISTAN reserves the right to proceed with the implementation of any Service, in whole or in part, as described in the Proposal.
- 2) The WWF-PAKISTAN reserves the right to engage in discussions with any BIDDER to clarify responses or discuss certain issues with regards to the proposal or services requested. The WWF-PAKISTAN has no obligation to notify the other BIDDERS of the discussions, clarifications, or other information provided by a BIDDER. Any additional information required for preparation of the BID shall be distributed to all participants at the same time.
- 3) The WWF-PAKISTAN reserves the right to award the proposal based on experience, qualification, completion date, service costand other criteria, and not necessarily the lowest cost.

3) PURPOSE

a. Objective of the Consultancy:

The consultant will be responsible for the identification and baseline assessments of Indigenous grasses and shribs of project districts; Abbottabad, Kohistan, Mansehra, Haripur, Upper Chitral, and Lower Chitral for ecosystem restoration. The grasses and shrubs which are beneficial for ecosystem restoration such as it stabilizing the receding land for slope stabilization, for the sustainability of check dams, and other engineering and bioengineering interventions that are meant for mitigation of erosion, flashflood and natural drainage control, etc.,

b. Specific Tasks:

- Conduct face-to-face meetings with the project staff to gather insights on expectations from both ends and discuss the timeline and scope of the study.
- Perform an extensive review of existing literature on indigenous grasses and shrubs in the project area, focusing on their uses for ecosystem restoration.

- Conduct field visits, surveys, interviews, and focus group discussions to identify indigenous grasses and their usage within the community in the project districts.
- Ensure that fieldwork covers all project sites comprehensively.
- Prepare a taxonomical checklist of the identified species, including their scientific, English name, vernacular, and local names, as well as their status and abundance in the study area, IUCN Red list status, including a clear photograph of habit and closeup along with the identification features.
- Document the sowing season and the ways to propagate the identified grasses/sadges and shrubs.
- Document and describe identified species of special concern from economic perspectives (market value, commercial uses, cost of cultivation, pest and disease resistance), ecological perspectives (biodiversity support, ecosystem stability, soil health, water regulation), soil-binding properties (root structure, erosion control, soil compaction, mycorrhizal associations, organic matter contribution).
- Incorporate examples/cases, where the identified indigenous grasses/shrubs are used for ecosystem restoration in Pakistan or specifically in project districts.
- Describe and assess potential threats to the identified species in the study area.
- Analyze the collected data and draft a comprehensive report with recommendations specifically for the use of grasses and shrubs for ecosystem restoration in the project districts.
- Ensure the study is well-written, clear, and concise.
- Incorporate tables and graphs to enhance understanding and engagement, ensuring they are clear, informative, and visually appealing.
- Provide explanations and contextual information alongside tables and graphs to help readers interpret the data accurately.
- Ensure consistency in style and formatting across all tables and graphs included in the report.
- Add citations and references of relevant research articles, conference papers, news articles, books, etc., to support the report.
- Draft and revise the report based on feedback from the project team.
- Revise the report as necessary to address all comments and suggestions from the project team.
- Incorporate all final revisions and feedback into the report.
- Submit the final report in digital form or as specified by the project team.
- All the field data will be the property and copyrights of WWF-Pakistan which will not be used in any type of publication.

4) Deliverables

- Summary of initial meetings with project staff, detailing insights and agreed timeline and scope of the study.
- Detailed workplan and methodology including tools for data collection for the baseline assessment.
- Detailed field visit and data collection plan.
- Preliminary findings and observations.
- Comprehensive draft of study including all findings, analyses, and recommendations.
- Revised draft incorporating feedback from the project team.
- Final version of the study in both digital and printed formats.

5) REQUIREMENTS

a. Qualification

• A degree in natural sciences, including but not limited to Plant taxonomist, Environmental Science, Forestry, Agriculture, natural resource management, etc.

b. Eligibility

- Demonstrated ability to write comprehensive, well-structured scientific studies, particularly baseline studies and assessments.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills to engage with project staff, communities, and other stakeholders to convey information clearly and persuasively.
- Strong organizational skills to manage multiple tasks, meet deadlines, and coordinate effectively with project teams and stakeholders.
- Meticulous attention to detail to ensure accuracy and precision in data collection, analysis and representation.
- Proficiency in creating visually appealing tables, graphs, and other visual aids to enhance the presentation of data and findings.

• Ability to work collaboratively with project teams, communities and other stakeholders, to gather information, incorporate feedback, and produce high-quality deliverables.

c. Experience

- A minimum of ten years of experience in conducting research and writing research reports/articles, with a preference for those focused on natural resource management.
- Experience working with international organizations or on donor-funded projects.

7) FORMAT OF THE PROPOSAL

The BID submitted by the participant must be structured as per the below provided instructions:

2) Experience:

- **a) Description of the complete projects:** the list and general information about the complete projects, description of the role in the project, and other accomplishments of the Consultant.
- 3) **Proposal outlining scope consultancy service-** Description of scope and working process, stages, deliverables, exclusions, conditions;
- 4) Provide template of already complete similar type of reports- the WWF-PAKISTAN may request additionally;
- 5) Service Provision Timeline Provide Detailed Work Plan as per Deliverable and TORs.
- 6) **Financial Proposal-** the prices shall be provided in Pak Rs, and the total price shall include all costs related to service provision including applicable taxes.

8) FINANCIAL PROPOSAL

The proposed prices shall be provided in PKR, the total price shall include all costs related to service provision including all Direct and Indirect taxes, Travel, Boarding & Lodging shall be based on actual receipt up to max Ceiling (If Any).

The consultant will submit the cost of the assignment in a lump sum, including all applicable taxes according to the Government of Pakistan and the Government of KP

The Payment Term: shall be defined by the contract to be concluded between WWF -Pakistan and the consultant.

9) EVALUATION PROCESS

Applicant's proposal shall be evaluated based on Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS) method. Under QCBS both technical and financial proposals shall be evaluated as per following criteria against a maximum score of 100 points.

- A) Technical Proposal (70%)
 - Detailed workplan
 - Expression of interest (EOI)
 - Company's Profile
 - Detailed methodology
- B) Financial Proposal (30%)
 - Detailed financial proposal which should be inclusive of all applicable taxes and out of pocket expenses. The financial proposal should follow a breakdown structure i.e., specifying cost(s) to each head and subhead
 - Company's registration certificate
 - NTN detail(s)
 - Any legal or technical certification required for the task
 - Audited Accounts Report (if available) of last FY

Note: Late/ incomplete submissions will not be accepted. Only three (03) top-ranked firms will be included in the comparative process

10) DOCUMENTATION AND CONFIDENTIALITY
