Background of Project & Assignment:

Pakistan's agricultural sector, while critical for food security and livelihoods, continues to rely heavily on subsidies that contribute to ecological degradation and unsustainable practices. These Environmentally Harmful Subsidies (EHS) particularly those associated with key crops such as wheat, rice, and maize encourage excessive use of water, fertilizers, and fossil fuels. This results in soil erosion, groundwater depletion, methane emissions, and the displacement of traditional, more sustainable crop varieties.

Despite global commitments under frameworks such as the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) which call for reform of EHS by 2025, to reduce them by at least \$500 billion each year by 2030. Pakistan's existing strategies, including the National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP) and updated Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), noted the EHS but provided only limited reference to it.

The current assignment is part of a broader effort to generate empirical evidence for informing policy reforms and aligning Pakistan's agricultural subsidy system with sustainability targets. By grounding advocacy in robust data and localized analysis, this assignment aims to support long-term reforms that repurpose harmful subsidies to reduce emissions, promote biodiversity, and enhance resource conservation.

2) GENERAL CONDITIONS

3) PURPOSE

a. Objective of the Consultancy:

WWF-Pakistan intends to on-board a consultant to provide technical expertise in analyzing the environmental, social, and economic impacts of subsidies on wheat, rice, and maize in Pakistan. The consultant will support the development and implementation of the study design including but not limited to the data analysis apply econometric models, and contribute to the development of a policy-ready final case study and repurposing recommendations.

b. Specific Tasks:

Study Design and Methodological Guidance

- Lead the co-design of the overall study research methodology, including sampling strategy, data collection instruments, and mixed-methods approach.
- Ensure alignment of study design with project objectives related to environmentally harmful subsidies, biodiversity, and emissions.

Tool Development and Pre-Testing Oversight

- Develop survey questionnaires, FGD guides, and stakeholder consultation templates focused on input and output use, subsidy structures, and ecological impacts, in consultation with the team.
- Provide technical input during pre-testing and refine tools based on field feedback for consistency and depth.

Data Analysis and Econometric Modelling

• Lead the analytical process using SPSS and Stata, including regression analysis and other econometric models to assess the impact of subsidies on environmental indicators.

Knowledge Product Development

Co-author key analytical sections of the final case study, ensuring robust interpretation of findings.

Stakeholder Engagement and Workshop Support

- Provide technical input into the design and delivery of the national stakeholder consultation workshop.
- Support synthesis of stakeholder insights and integration into the final policy brief and recommendations.

Quality Assurance and Advisory Support

- Offer continuous advisory support to ensure scientific integrity and methodological soundness throughout the project lifecycle.

- At least 10-12 years of experience in agricultural policy, subsidy analysis, and environmental sustainability, with a focus on biodiversity and nature-positive approaches.
- Proven expertise in designing and implementing research methodologies, including FGDs, surveys, and KIIs, for complex policy studies.
- Strong understanding of Pakistan's agricultural sector, including its subsidy frameworks, environmental impacts, and alignment with national and international sustainability goals (e.g., NBSAPs, NDCs).

The BID submitted by the participant must be structured as per the below provided instructions:

- 4) **Provide template of already complete similar type of reports-** the WWF-PAKISTAN may request additionally;
- 5) Service Provision Timeline Provide Detailed Work Plan as per Deliverable and TORs.
- 6) **Financial Proposal** the prices shall be provided in Pak Rs, the total price shall include all costs related to service provision including applicable taxes.

8) FINANCIAL PROPOSAL

The proposed prices shall be provided in PKR, the total price shall include all costs related to service provision including all Direct and Indirect taxes, Travel, Boarding & Lodging shall be based on actual receipt up to max Ceiling (If Any).

The consultant will submit the cost of the assignment in a lump sum, including all applicable taxes according to the Government of Pakistan and the Government of KP

The Payment Term: shall be defined by the contract to be concluded between WWF -Pakistan and the consultant.

9) EVALUATION PROCESS

Applicant's proposal shall be evaluated based on Quality and Cost Based Selection (QCBS) method. Under QCBS both technical and financial proposals shall be evaluated as per following criteria against a maximum score of 100 points.

- A) Technical Proposal (70%)
 - Detailed workplan
 - Expression of interest (EOI)
 - Company's Profile
 - Detailed methodology
- B) Financial Proposal (30%)
 - Detailed financial proposal which should be inclusive of all applicable taxes and out of pocket expenses. The financial proposal should follow a breakdown structure i.e., specifying cost(s) to each head and subhead
 - Company's registration certificate
 - NTN detail(s)
 - Any legal or technical certification required for the task
 - Audited Accounts Report (if available) of last FY

Note: Late/ incomplete submissions will not be accepted. Only three (03) top-ranked firms will be included in the comparative process

10) DOCUMENTATION AND CONFIDENTIALITY

All documents completed based on requirements of the present RFP shall be the property of the WWF-Pakistan, and shall not without the consent of the WWF-Pakistan be used, reproduced or made available to third parties beyond what is necessary in respect of the fulfilment of the Project. All documents issued and information given to the BIDDER shall be treated as confidential.

11) BUDGET

The total budget for this activity, inclusive of all taxes and out-of-pocket expenses, amounts to PKR 850,000/-. Payments will be made according to the deliverables, and after the applicable taxes are deducted, the net payment will be provided to the Consultant.
